They have identified the team and started negotiations to bring them on board to complete the work. Mr. Santos was pleased, because for the last two weeks, he and his staff were issuing stop notices for non-compliance for construction errors that have occurred.  The contractor was at first hesitant to hire a team but due to recent events, he is now convinced it is necessary to do so. One of the big items that he was referring to was during the last big rainfall, the form work had shifted before the cement was poured. GHURA's staff noted the shift after the pouring.	Albert Santos

		Mr. Albert Santos stated six contractors submitted a bid. However, the lowest bidder, Triple Tech Inc. was disqualified due to being non-responsive in submitting all the required documents. Staff met with the next lowest bidder, Arkana Pacific. Arkana Pacific had successfully completed a couple of GHURA's public housing units that were placed under modernization.			
		Work consists of removing an existing wall, gutting out the bathtub and putting in a shower, retiling the bathroom, retiling the floor, rebuilding the kitchen counter and installing LED lighting. Work will begin with one unit at a time to include moving the tenant to the manager's unit while the work is underway. They will assist with moving the tenant back to their renovated unit. This is included in their cost. The timelines given to the contractor to complete is 17 days per unit and 2 days between units.

Bid opening for the subject project was held on June 12, 2018 at 2:00PM. There were, a total of 6 contractors that purchase a set of bid specification of which 4 submitted a bid. Listed below are the results of the bids submitted, which were open and read out aloud.

Government Estimate: \$135,270.00

In reviewing the bid results our staff scheduled several meetings with the contractors listed above as #2 and #4 to determine if their bid proposals are responsive in their submission of the required work as stated in the bid specification.

On June 14, 2018 our staff met with Mr. Manabat, owner of AM Manabat Corporation and his staff to review their cost proposal which is 35% lower than the Government estimate and their understanding for the addition of a new drain spouts for 250 units and the work required to construct a 140ft, reinforced concrete swale at AMP1.

In reviewing their cost breakdown, it was obvious that they misinterpret several details in the construction and placement of the required down spouts at 454 locations. Mr. Manabat did admit they did rush in putting their cost together rather quickly and should have attended both the pre-bid and site review for the project. We did informe him that based on our review and his understanding of the scope, GHURA has determine that his bid is non-responsive.

Therefore, our staff met with the next lowest bidder, Triple Tech Inc., President Mrs. Wu, who's bid is at 15% lower than the government estimate. In our discussion with Mrs. Wu, we wanted to be assured that they fully understood the scope, details and amount area to be worked. She stated that while their cost is lower that our estimate, she believes that the work is straight

forward and that much of the drain piping system will be pre-fab in their shop/assembly line for the 454 units to be install. She stated that its estimated that the first few installations might take over 3 hours to install but will improve over time to 2 hours.

Based on the meeting held with Triple Tech staff, our staff have determined them to be the lowest responsive responsible bidder for Base Bid Item No. 1 and have been cleared by Department of Labor compliance, OSHA and EPLS Debarred list (see attached verification). Triple Tech does have a history with GHURA they completed the up-grade of Astumbo Garden Park in Dededo which include a new basketball court and walking trial. Contractor is also a woman own company.

Based on our staff's review and determination, we are requesting that the Board approve a contract with Triple Tech Inc for Base Bid Item No. 1 in the amount of \$116,200.00 for addition of a new drain spout to all of GHURA 250 housing units. Funds are available under the CAP funds



Bid opening for the subject project was held on May 29, 2018 at 2:00PM. There was a total of 16 contractors that purchased a set of bid specification of which 9 submitted a bid. Listed below are the results of the bids submitted, which were open and read out aloud.

In reviewing the bid results and all required submitted documents our staff had determine that Arkana Pacific Contractors proposal is non-responsive based on their current contractor's license classification of A, B and C33. Due to the nature of the required work for demolition, which is more than 35% of the entire scope of work, a License Specialty Contractor Classification of C11 is required to undertake the project. The C11 classification for Demolition is a specialty Contractor whose contracting business is the execution of contracts requiring the ability to intelligently demolish all types of building or structure and to remove all of such building or structure from the premises on which it was built.

In review of the next lowest bidder bid documents JT Angoco & Sons, our staff did determine that their proposal submitted is responsive. We met with them to ensure that they fully understood the scope of work and amendments issued for the project.

On June 20, 2018 our staff met with JT Angoco & Sons, Mr. Angoco to review their cost proposal and their understanding of our two concerns as stated in the bid specification:

- 1) That these existing structures are assumed to contain components coated with LBP and/or other lead-containing materials (LCM). As such, disturbance/demolition of these units and disposal of the ensuing construction debris must be performed in accordance with the OSHA lead standard for construction (29 CFR 1926.62) and US EPA hazardous waste regulations (40 CFR Parts 240-282). The OSHA lead standard includes requirements for worker training, medical surveillance, air monitoring, personal protective equipment, and hygiene facilities.
- 2) Considering the date of construction of these homes in the 1960's, the units may contain asbestos-containing materials (ACM). Hazardous pesticides may also have been used to treat the soils/fill materials around and below the structure. The contractor shall hire an independent third-party inspector to determine the presence (or absence) of such hazardous materials

Based on our meeting which they confirm they fully understand the scope of work including our issues with the potential hazards identified in these structures, we requested that they submit a bid confirmation as shown on the attachment.

Based on the meeting held with JT Angoco & Sons our staff have determine them to be the lowest responsive responsible bidder for Base Bid item 1 and have been cleared by Department of Labor compliance, OSHA and EPLS Debarred list (see attached verification).

JT Angoco & Sons prior demolition experience included the Old GMH and Fujita Hotel as a sub-contractor for Maeda Pacific Corp and demo work on the military base.

Based on our staff's review and determination, we are requesting that the Board approve a contract with JT Angoco & Sons for Base Bid Item No.1 in the amount of \$98,900.00 for the Demolition of four housing structures in Dededo. The award is contingent on the final release of funds from HUD which is currently under review.

SUBJECT PY 2018 Annual Action Plan (Draft)

Hafa Adai Director:

Guam's Annual Action Plan (AAP) for Program Year 2018 (Fiscal Year 2019) is submitted here in draft. The AAP is Guam's annual report to HUD that describes the allocations of Community Planning and Development funds to address the housing, homeless, community development and economic development needs of Guam's low- and moderate-income residents and communities.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD's) Office of Community Planning and Development (CPD) has announced Guam's 2018 allocation of \$4,404,817 for projects intended to benefit the island's low- and moderate-income populations and special needs populations with improved community facilities, increased services to persons in need, and housing opportunities for new homebuyers. The following is a summary of the allocation for each program:

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG): \$ 3,096,003 Home Investment Partnerships Grant (HOME): \$ 1,073,432 Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG): \$ 235,382

A brief description of each of the projects is as follows:

- 1. <u>Central Community Arts Hall:</u> Funds will be used to construct a lecture and theaterstyle building that will have a 150-seat capacity. The project will serve approximately 1,375 LMI individuals.
- 2. <u>Residential Treatment Center for Women:</u> Funds will support The Salvation Army's Lighthouse Recovery Center for women. This will include new construction of a residential facility with 14-beds to provide in-patient services to women with substance use disorders. Additional space will be used to provide outpatient services. The project will serve approximately 60 LMI individuals annually.

GHURA does not discriminate against persons with disabilities.

The Chief Planner has been designated as Section 504 Coordinator.

- 3. <u>The Opportunity Initiative:</u> Funds will be used to provide workforce development training, jobs assistance and youth and family empowerment activities in neighborhoods with predominantly low- and moderate-income families. An estimated 200 LMI individuals will be served.
- 4. <u>Homeless Management Information System</u>: Funds will support The Salvation Army's cash match requirement for its Continuum of Care Program grant. HMIS is utilized by various homeless service providers to store client level information of the persons served through the homeless programs. The database will capture data of 1,168 individuals in approximately 555 households.
- 5. <u>Lighthouse Recovery Center:</u> Funds will support operational costs for transitional and supportive housing programs and outpatient services to homeless, no-to-low/moderate income and at-risk for homeless men seeking recovery from substance abuse. An estimated 180 LMI individuals will be served by the project.
- 6. <u>Family Services Center/One-Stop Homeless Assistance Center:</u> Funds will support The Salvation Army services such as financial assistance, housing relocation, and stabilization for individuals who are homeless or at-risk of becoming homeless. The project will serve 55 households whose members qualify as LMI individuals.
- 7. <u>Kurason YSengsong:</u> Funds will be utilized to provide youth programming, leadership and development activities, community engagement, and educational and recreational programs. An estimated 275 LMI individuals will be served by this project.
- 8. CDBG Administration: Funds will pay for general administration costs.
- 9. <u>CDBG Planning:</u> Funds will pay for general planning costs.
- 10. <u>Building Hopes, Home and Community-Phase III:</u> Funds will be used to construct one single-family home for an income eligible family. The project will benefit 1 income-eligible household.
- 11. <u>Tai Village Mutual Self-Help Homes- Phase I:</u> Funds will be used to acquire 10 lots to serve low-and moderate-income communities through the Mutual Self-Help program. The project will benefit 10 income-eligible households.
- 12. HOME Administration: Funds will pay for general administration and planning costs.
- 13. <u>Family Services Center/One-Stop Homeless Assistance Center:</u> Funds will be used provide up to three months of short-term rental, deposits and utility assistance as well as up to 24 months of medium-term rental and utility assistance to households eligible to receive homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing services. Clients will work closely with a Case Worker to create an agreeable plan of action to address challenges. An estimated 55 households will be assisted by this project.
- 14. ESG Administration: Funds will pay for general administration of the program.
