No. 116/17		Section 8 Lottery Update (Reference Minute No. 051/17)  Ms. Norma San Nicolas stated that there are a total of 1,426 applicants on the waitlist to include 155 applicants who were on the waitlist prior to the completion of the lottery process. These 155 applicants have received their letter of selection and are being processed for housing.  There are 1,271applicants from the lottery process who completed the application process and are now on the waitlist. The first 100 applicants from the lottery process were selected this week and have completed the mass screening stage.  Ms. San Nicolas provided more details on the applicants on the waitlist:  Non-elderly disabled – 43 applicants  Family Unification Program – 20 applicants  Director Duenas stated that out of the first 100 selected for the mass screening, 92 attended. This figure is a high response in

Guma Trankilidat wasn't up for review this year because they got a high enough score last year to get a one year bye. GT will be up for inspection this November.  Mr. A. Santos stated that 3 out of the 4 AMPs passed. The scores are AMP1 – 68 pts., AMP2 – 80 pts., AMP3 - 62 pts., and AMP4 - 59 pts. The first 3 sites were reviewed by Mr. Brian Easthorn. 
#### 124/17 **ADJOURNMENT**
