	Chairman Rivera requested more information regarding the Section 8 write-off figures. Deputy Director Esteves stated that to be fiscally sound and be up to date with its write-offs, GHURA's Section 8 program has had to go back to the year 2000 and reconcile its accounts receivable to the present day. He added that GHURA has updated the processes more vigorously and continues to do so. Chairman Rivera asked why the timeline was so long. Mrs. Frances Danieli, Fiscal Controller, stated that the 2022 Audit indicated that the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Accounts Receivable was high. In the year 2000, the amount was grandfathered into GHURA's new system. She added that the amount from the year 2000 would be a starting point to begin the write-off so that every ninety days, the difference will be from the starting point amount and the amount for the month. This will allow for consistency in the decrease of the starting point amount. Chairman Rivera inquired about whether GHURA would be impacted by this process. Mrs. Danieli stated that GHURA will continue to report accounts receivable as it has in the past.	
	Vice Chairman Sanchez asked what would be categorized as tenant fraud. Mrs. Nicole Alejandro, Section 8 Administrator, stated that an example of fraudulent activity by tenants includes unreported income. During an annual recertification, any discovered

She also indicated that they received \$24, 263.00 for administrative fees which may be applied towards security deposits or utility arrears also for VASH recipients. Dear Director Napoli:

Buenas Yan Hafa Adai! This is a request for an equitable adjustment for the Rehabilitation of the Hagatna Heights Four-Plex project. The project details, timeline, financial impacts, and recommendation are shown below:

1. Executive Summary:

- GHURA's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) division purchased a two-story apartment building for rehabilitation in December 18, 2023.
- The facility's rehabilitation Scope of Work successfully underwent a public bid, GHURA 24-11, that closed on July 2024. The lowest and best qualified bidder was Guam Evergreen
 Construction Corporation awarded in the amount of \$289,900. GHURA issued the Notice to Proceed (NTP) to Evergreen on October 21, 2024.
- During the contractor's permit application, the Department of Land Management (DLM) discovered that the parcel was zoned commercial rather than residential.
- Permit processing was suspended until zoning could be reconciled. The issue is now fully resolved, but the contractor incurred stand-by costs and schedule impacts while waiting.
- The proposed equitable adjustment compensates the contractor for documented, uncontrollable delays, and allows the project to proceed without jeopardizing federal funding or affordable-housing goals.

3. Cause of Delay (Unforeseeable Conditions)

- 1. Latent Zoning Discrepancy Public land-use maps mislabeled the parcel; neither GHURA nor bidders could reasonably identify the error during solicitation.
- 2. Regulatory Suspension DLM halted all activity until zoning aligned with intended residential use, outside the contractor's control.
- 3. HUD Funding Constraints Project cancellation was not a viable option as it affected existing commitments to the HTF and HOME grant funding agreements
