After notice was duly given, pursuant to the Open Government Law of Guam and the Bylaws of the Authority, the Board of Commissioners' regularly scheduled board meeting was called to order at 12:02 P.M., Friday, September 24, 2021, at the GHURA Sinajana Main Office, 1st floor Conference room, by Acting Chairwoman Guzman. She indicated that 5 members of the Board of Commissioners were present, representing a quorum and that the meeting would proceed as scheduled.

IV. APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS BOARD MINUTES

[127/21] Commissioner Delia motioned to approve the board meeting minutes of September 10, 2021 as corrected. Commissioner Ishizaki seconded the motion. There were no objections. The motion was approved.

V. OLD BUSINESS

1. [128/21] INTENT OF AWARD- IFB#GHURA-COCC-021-007; New Vehicles- (12) New Pick-up Trucks (REF: MINUTE No. 119/21 and 120/21)

DISCUSSION- Director Topasna stated the following:

- GHURA issued an Invitation for Bid (IFB) for (12) new pick-up trucks.
- (3) bids were submitted by: Atkins Kroll, Triple J Ent. Inc., Monster Corp. (DBA Autospot)-
- The IFB was divided into (2) separate bid packages:
 - 1. Bid Item #1- to procure (7) pick-up trucks with extended cabs, 4-wheel drive and V6 models. The various PH sites and Guma Trankilidat will need the 4-wheel drive and V6 models for towing purposes and the transportation of cargo. The trucks are to be assigned as follows-AMP1 (1 truck), AMP3 (1 truck), AMP4 (4 trucks), Guma Trankilidat (1 truck).
 - 2. Bid Item #2- to procure (5) pick-up trucks with extended cabs, 2- wheel drive, and 4 Cylinders. To be assigned as follows- Section 8 (4 trucks), ROSS Program (1 truck)
- Upon GHURA's review of the bid submissions, it was determined that **Triple J Ent. Inc.** bid packet was rejected due the non-payment of the \$50 bid registration fee.
- Atkins Kroll and Monster Corp. were deemed responsive having satisfied the IFB administrative requirements.
- Atkins Kroll's bid was misquoted and had to be pulled from the previous board meeting agenda due to the bid not meeting the minimum specifications.
- GHURA requests that the board approve the award of contract to Monster Corp. (DBA Autospot)
 for Bid Item#1 in the amount of \$265,965. 00 for (7) pick-up trucks.
- GHURA requests that the board also approve the award of contract to Atkins Kroll for Bid Item#2 in the amount of \$146,000 for (5) pick-up trucks.
- He stated that the Bid tabulations and vehicle specifications are included in the bid packet.

Commissioner Ishizaki inquired about the misquote by Atkins Kroll. Director Topasna stated that the Atkins Kroll bid did not include the 4-wheel drive option. GHURA had to clarify the misquote. Commission Ishizaki indicated that perhaps Atkins Kroll was not responsive. Director Topasna confirmed this.

There were no further discussions.

[129/21] ACTION- Commissioner Pereda moved to approve the INTENT OF AWARD- IFB#GHURA-COCC-021-007; for the purchase of (12) New Pick-up Trucks to Atkins Kroll for Bid Item #2 in the amount of \$146,000 and for Bid Item #1 to Monster Corp. in the amount of \$265,965. Commissioner Delia seconded the motion. There were no objections by the other commissioners. The motion was passed.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

1. [130/21] INTENT OF AWARD- RESOLUTION FY2021-022- A Resolution to ratify actions taken by the GHURA Board of Commissioners in the period following the enactment of Guam Public Law 36-34

DISCUSSION- Director Topasna stated the following:

- Public Law-36-34 was enacted on June 11, 2021 requiring the broadcasting of public meetings and the publication of a notice of agenda items.
- GHURA was made aware of requirements of PL 36-34 on September 15, 2021 and took immediate action to comply with the new law.
- Prior to being made aware of the requirements of PL36-34, the GHURA board had deliberated and approved actions during meetings conducted on July 23, August 13, August 27, and September 10. Included in the packet are supporting documents of the board actions for all (4) board meetings.
- GHURA is requesting that the board ratify the actions taken during the (4) meetings.
- Director Topasna deferred the discussion to Mr. Anthony Perez, GHURA Legal Counsel, who stated that PL36-34 basically added (2) new requirements:
 - 1. Meetings have to be streamed live and a link provided to the public and;
 - 2. The board agenda must be specific.
- The moment that GHURA learned of the new requirements, GHURA took immediate action to comply with that law.
- Unfortunately, 30 days after the new PL36-34 requirement was enacted, GHURA had 4 board meetings that weren't compliant with PL36-34.
- To try and cure things, Mr. Perez explained that today's meeting is to ratify the past actions of the (4) previous board meetings.

Commissioner Ishizaki inquired about whether the ratification by the board would correct the (4) meetings items or will the board have to re-discuss and re-vote on the previous BOC meeting agenda

items. Mr. Perez indicated that he did not believe that re-voting was necessary and that the board will

just have to ratify the actions taken on the agenda items of the (4) previous meetings. He added that if the board would prefer to discuss each meeting and each item as to the previous actions taken, he would defer to the board. Mr. Perez stated that the intention of the day's meeting was to request that the board ratify the actions taken at the previous board meetings. He also added that although the actions taken at the previous board meetings were done at an Open Board meeting, streamed live via zoom, and notices were published in the paper for those meetings. However, the main distinction that GHURA did not comply with is that it did not provide the specificity required in this Public Law regarding noticing the agenda. Subject to the board's approval, Mr. Perez indicated that the board ratify the actions taken which are attached to the resolution on pages 49-53.

Acting Chairwoman Guzman stated that the public notice and agenda indicated that the advertisement was paid for by GHURA and asked if that information was sufficient. Mr. Perez stated that it was sufficient and stated that GHURAs notice is in conformance with PL 36-34. Director Topasna added that GHURA has various funding source options, but all funding sources fall under GHURA. Commissioner Ishizaki requested that the Resolved section of the resolution read, "Based on the advice of Legal Counsel..." Mr. Perez and Chairwoman Guzman agreed that the language would include, "Based on the advice of Legal Counsel, the GHURA Board of Commissioners now ratifies the actions..." Mr. Perez stated that he was comfortable with the language. He also stated that should there be additional guidance from the front office and the AG's office regarding this issue, GHURA has been and will continue to be proactive.

[131/21] ACTION- Acting Chairwoman Guzman moved to approve - RESOLUTION FY2021-022- A Resolution to ratify actions taken by the GHURA Board of Commissioners in the period following the enactment of Guam Public Law 36-34 ensuring that the addition of the line in the Resolve is incorporated into the final Resolution. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Karl Corpus. There were no objections. The Resolution carried.

2. [132/21] INTENT OF AWARD- IFB#GHURA-COCC-021-009-PH/GT; Refrigerators, Electric Stoves, Water Heaters, and Coin Operated Washers and Dryers- IDIQ

DISCUSSION- Director Topasna stated the following:

- GHURA issued an IFB for whitegoods under an IDIQ
- 6 vendors expressed interest: Town House Furniture, Pacific Guam, The Product Solutions, Pacific Link Consulting, AFM Wholesale, and Deesonii's
- 8 vendors submitted bids
- 2 vendors were rejected due to the non-payment of bid registration fee.
- The IFB was broken up into 10 separate Bid Items #s:
 - 1. (45) Refrigerators- 15-16 cu ft
 - 2. (86) Refrigerators- 17-18 cu ft
 - 3. (15) Refrigerators- 19-21 cu ft
 - 4. (65) Rear Control Electric stoves- 30 inches
 - 5. (52) Front Control electric stoves-30 inches

- 6. (30) Water Heaters 19-20 gallons, Electric
- 7. (10) Water Heaters 30 gallons, Electric
- 8. (40) Water Heaters 30 gallons, Electric
- 9. (2) Electric Coin Operated Commercial Washer with Meter case, ADA Compliant
- 10. (2) Electric Coin Operated Commercial Dryer with meter case, ADA Compliant
- Upon the Staff's review of the bid submissions, it was noted that AFM Wholesale is the lowest bidder for Bid Item #4, (rear control electric stove- 30 inches) did not meet the minimum required specification of 30 inches. (AFM Wholesale-Amana stove, 29 7/8 inches).
- For the remaining Bid Items, the respective lowest, responsive bidders met the minimum specifications.
- GHURA requests that the board approve the following:
 - Bid Item #1- to be awarded to Desonii's for \$26,055
 - Bid Item #2- to be awarded to Desonii's for \$51,514
 - Bid Item #3- to be awarded to Desonii's for \$11,685
 - Bid Item #4- to be awarded to Town House Furniture for \$34,060
 - Bid Item #5- to be awarded to Town House Furniture for \$39,104
 - Bid Item #6- to be awarded to The Product Solution for \$14,220
 - Bid Item #7- to be awarded to The Product Solutions for \$6,350
 - Bid Item #8- to be awarded to The Product Solutions for \$23,960
 - Bid Item #9- to be awarded to AFM Wholesale for \$3,598
 - Bid Item #10- to be awarded to AFM Wholesale for \$3,598

TOTAL COLLECTIVE AWARD OF \$214,144.00

Acting Chairwoman Guzman inquired about the timeline of the delivery and installation of the items. Director Topasna stated that it is a one-year contract, but items should be delivered in advance. He deferred to Miss Greta Balmeo for further details. She indicated that a request was made to extend the delivery date of the appliances. Typical delivery days is 45 days, however, due to COVID19 restrictions and manufacturer delivery delays, GHURA has extended for up to 120 days. GHURA is making the necessary accommodations to work with suppliers. She added that she is working with suppliers if an immediate need arises, available and in stock appliances will be delivered. Acting Chairwoman Guzman asked if the bidders are responsible for disposing of the old appliances. Miss Balmeo stated that the bidders are only responsible for the ordering and delivery of new appliances. She also added that each of the AMP sites have budgets set aside for disposal of appliances, green waste, heavy metal and wood. She indicated that the purchase of trucks for the AMP sites will be able to accommodate trailers to have the capacity to tow multiple appliances, as needed. Director Topasna added that the disposal of the old appliances will be a separate contract.

There were no further discussions.

[133/21] ACTION- Commissioner Ishizaki made a motion to approve the INTENT OF AWARD- IFB#GHURA-COCC-021-009-PH/GT to award a total of \$214,144.00 to Bid Item #1- to be awarded to Desonii's for \$26,055, Bid Item #2- to be awarded to Desonii's for \$51,514,

Bid Item #3- to be awarded to Desonii's for \$11,685, Bid Item #4- to be awarded to Town House Furniture for \$34,060, Bid Item #5- to be awarded to Town House Furniture for \$39,104

Bid Item #6- to be awarded to The Product Solutions for \$14,220, Bid Item #7- to be awarded to The Product Solutions for \$6,350, Bid Item #8- to be awarded to The Product Solutions for \$23,960, Bid Item #9- to be awarded to AFM Wholesale for \$3,598 and, Bid Item #10- to be awarded to AFM Wholesale for \$3,598 totaling \$214, 144. Commissioner Delia seconded the motion. There were no objections to the motion. The motion passed.

3. [134/21] RESOLUTION- FY2021-023- Resolution approving Above-Step Recruitment for the Accountant III position.

DISCUSSION- Director Topasna stated the following:

- This Resolution is to approve the Above Step for the Accountant III position.
- Mr. Jerricho Garcia was recently promoted to Accountant III.
- He had submitted a request for an Above Step Recruitment which is now brought before the board for approval.
- Mr. Garcia's qualifications for Accountant III are as follows:
 - 1. Received his CPA certification in August 2020.
 - 2. Received a Bachelor's degree in Administration in Accounting from UOG.
 - 3. Has acquired 24 semester hours in a Master's program.
 - 4. Has a year and two months of auditing experience with Deloitte & Touche.
 - 5. Has served 3 years of Active Duty in the United States Army as an E4.
 - 6. Possesses internal auditing skills.
- Director Topasna requested that the board approve a salary competitive with the private sector at NG3-8E or approximately \$60,182 or \$28.93 per hour.
- In consideration of Mr. Garcia's exceptional knowledge and skills, Director Topasna requested that the board approve the Above Step Recruitment request.

There were no further discussions.

[135/21] ACTION- Commissioner Delia motioned to approve RESOLUTION- FY2021-023 approving Above-Step Recruitment for the Accountant III position for Jerricho Garcia. Commissioner Ishizaki seconded the motion. There were no objections by the other board members. There motion was passed.

4. [136/21] RESOLUTION-FY 2021-024- Resolution commending Mr. Sabino P. Flores for his dedication and contributions as the Chairman of the GHURA Board of Commissioners.

DISCUSSION- Director Topasna stated the following:

- Mr. Sabino Flores has resigned as the Chairman from the GHURA Board of Commissioners.
- GHURA is requesting that the board approve the Resolution commending Mr. Flores for his
 dedication and contributions as the Chairman of the Board.

- GHURA plans to invite Mr. Flores to the next board meeting to present him the resolution.
- The Resolution identifies all of Mr. Flores's achievements and contributions as the Chairman over the last two and a half years.

Acting Chairwoman Guzman requested that the Resolution include the signature of all the GHURA Board members.

[137/21] ACTION- Acting Chairwoman Guzman motioned to approve RESOLUTION-FY 2021-024-commending Mr. Sabino P. Flores for his dedication and contributions as the Chairman of the GHURA Board of Commissioners and to include the signature blocks of all GHURA Board members. Commissioner Pereda seconded the motion. There were no objections by the other board members. The motion was passed.

5. [138/21] FY 2021-025- Resolution approving Fiscal Year 2022 Operating and Administrative Budget.

DISCUSSION- Director Topasna stated the following:

- This Operating and Administrative budget amount is the largest amount ever brought before the board for approval.
- The authority must continue its primary mission to provide safe, decent, and sanitary housing to the people of Guam.
- It must continue to ensure the operation of the low rent for public housing, Section 8 vouchers, elderly and Community and Development Programs.
- It must ensure the continued payment of personnel salaries, benefits, and other administrative expenditure.
- The Resolution also gives the Executive Director transfer authority of 10%.
- GHURA is requesting that the board approve an Operating and Administrative budget of \$97,930,251.00 for FY22.
- This is a 20.57% increase over the previous FISCAL Year budget of \$83,220,136.
- Director Topasna deferred to Mrs. Lucele Leon Guerrero, GHURA Controller.

Mrs. Lucele Leon Guerrero stated the following:

- \$16,710,115 increase from the FY2021 of \$81,220,136
- GHURA received new grants:
 - 1. Emergency Housing Voucher (EHV)
 - 2. HOME-American Rescue Plan (ARP)
 - 3. Allocations for the CDBG CARES ACT
 - 4. Additional Funding for the current year for CDBG
 - 5. Ongoing Projects for Capital Funds
 - 6. Public Housing ongoing projects
 - 7. An increase in the Section 8 Housing Choice Vouchers Program for lease ups/PUCs
- Increase in Budget Categories have also increased for new assignments.
- There are increases in GPA and GWA billing.

- There will be new Capital outlays/projects. An increase of 34.93%
- GHURA will be making loan payments for Section 108. Loan payments have increased by 393%. There is an increase in the Housing Assistance Payments of 14.76%.

Director Topasna stated that although GHURA is requesting that the board approve an almost \$98M budget, collectively and inclusively of the Low Income Housing Tax Credits that GHURA will bring before the board later in the year, for FY22 \$163,930,000 is approximately what GHURA will be handling. GHURA is also aware that there is a possibility that an additional \$31,000,000 may be allocated for CDBG. If that happens, GHURA may be looking at about \$194,000,000 for FY22. He expressed his reasons for going before the board requesting the approval of Above Step recruitments in order to compete with the private sector, the military, and even the autonomous agencies that may offer a more lucrative compensation plan.

Director Topasna requested that the board approve an Operating and Administrative budget of \$97,930,251.00 for FY22.

Deputy Director Napoli indicated that there was a typographical error on the first and third Whereas on the Resolution. It read FY2021 and should read FY2022.

Commissioner Ishizaki requested clarification on the Revenue category specifically the 104 grants. Mrs. Leon Guerrero stated that the programs listed are the Capital Fund Program, Community Development Block Grant, CDBG CARES ACT, Down payment and Closing Costs Assistance (DPCCA), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), Emergency Solution Cares Act Grant (ESGCV), HOME Investment Partnership Grant, HOME American Rescue Plan Grant (ARP), HOME Rehabilitation Program, Low Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC), Low Rent Housing (Public Housing/Asset Management Project (AMP), Low Rent Housing/Public Housing CARES ACT Grant, Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT), Resident Opportunity Supportive Services (ROSS), Family Self Sufficiency Program (FSS), Housing Choice Voucher CARES ACT (HCVCA), Section 8 Emergency Housing Voucher Grant.

Acting Chairwoman Guzman inquired about whether board approval was necessary for the potential incoming budget. Mrs. Leon Guerrero stated that if the new funding arrives and new expenses arise that are not included in the approved budget and is over the 10% transfer authority that the Executive Director has approval for, GHURA must go before the board for approval. Director Topasna informed the board that Governor Leon Guerrero received a letter from HUD stating that GHURA has been awarded another \$3.88M under the America Rescue Plan.

Acting Chairwoman Guzman stated that she believes that GHURA is up to the challenge of spending down all the money it is receiving and making sure that the people of Guam benefit from all this funding.

Director Topasna added that GHURA has 111 full-time employees. If you divide 111 employees into 97,930,251 it gives you a total personnel cost of about .000113% of operations. Acting Chairwoman Guzman stated that that statistic shows that the staff and management at GHURA are very committed and hardworking. On behalf of the board, she asked that the Executive Director let everyone at GHURA know that the board appreciates their hard work, loyalty, and dedication.

There were no further discussions.

[139/21] ACTION- Commissioner Pereda moved to approve FY2022-025 Fiscal Year 2022 Operating and Administrative Budget. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Delia. There were no objections by the other board members. The motion passed.

Acting Chairwoman Guzman stated that the zoom recording will stop and the board room cleared as the GHURA BOC goes into Executive Session.

Upon review of the bid submissions, Triple J Enterprises, Inc.'s bid was rejected due to non-payment of the \$50.00 bid registration fee. Atkins Kroll and Monster Corp. were deemed responsive having satisfied the administrative requirements of the IFB. However, Atkins Kroll's bid for Bid Item #1 was misquoted and did not meet the minimum specifications.

Overall, GHURA is requesting for the Board of Commissioners approval for awards to Monster Corp. dba Autospot for Bid Item #1 in the amount of Two Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Nine Hundred Sixty-Five Dollars and Zero Cents (\$265,965.00) for (7) pick-up trucks; and to Atkins Kroll for Bid Item #2 in the amount of One Hundred Forty-Six Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$146,000.00) for (5) pickup trucks.
